Identity & Idolatry: The tandem effect on our relationship with God (Panorama Ballroom – 21st Floor)



on the fact that the issue of homelessness must be addressed, and in some cases eliminated. Rescue

Missions along with other social service agencies have agreed that a partnership, or a sharing of information and resources, provides the basis for establishing a strategy based on a continuum of care. In many cases, these agencies with support from city government find themselves focusing on funding allocations, emergency issues, and the annual point in time count. What is often lacking is leadership in being able to address the real issues with real decision makers at the table with the ability, and capacity to offer real change. The Fort Wayne Rescue Mission participates with the revised Fort Wayne Area Planning Council, but provides leadership at the highest level to address the root causes of homelessness, and a well thought out strategy to meet the needs of a growing city and county at the invitation of the city leaders, while growing its reach and revenue. This seminar will address; (1) The state of homelessness, how to get the facts; (2) Knowing who the right players are amidst the crowd; (3) Participating without compromising your vision, mission and values; (4) What Rescue Mission and city leadership should look like; (5) Developing a healthy, sustainable strategy for leading your city while growing your mission; and (6) Who to send, and how to play well with the area planning council.
